


As part of its efforts to implement the John D. Dingell, Jr. Conservation, Management, and Recreation Act, the Bureau of Land Management (BLM) will provide the priority access list that identifies existing public lands needing improved access for the public to hunt, fish, or use the land for other recreational purposes. This Act directs the Department of the Interior to ask for the public's input to identify BLM-managed lands where there is no legal public access or where access is significantly restricted. During the 30 day public nomination period, use the following instructions to submit a parcel nomination.

To submit a new nomination use the **Nominate Parcels** widget shown below in red.



The *Legend* widget dynamically displays the layers that are toggled 'on' in the Layer List.




The tool contains reference data that displays previously nominated polygons, BLM land boundaries, BLM Administrative Boundaries, National Conservation Lands and Wilderness Study areas. Interact with the layers in the *Layer List* widget.




The **Reference** widget opens the **Basemap Galler**y and the **Add Data** widget.





To zoom the map viewer to an address or place use the **Search** widget. Click on the down arrow to search specific names from BLM reference layers.
